### **ASABE PUBLISHES NEW TEST PROTOCOL FOR LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION DEVICES**

ST JOSEPH, MICHIGAN— The American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers (ASABE) has published ANSI/ASABE S633, Testing Protocol for Landscape Irrigation Soil Moisture–Based Control Technologies.

This new standard provides a test method to validate the responsiveness to changing soil moisture conditions of soil moisture sensing devices that integrate with irrigation controllers to better manage water resources in landscape settings.
