ASABE REVISES CAB ENCLOSURE STANDARD FOR HVAC FILTERS

ST JOSEPH, MICHIGAN— The American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers (ASABE) has completed a revision of Part 3 of the standard series to improve air-quality systems of agricultural cabs.

The revision, ANSI/ASABE S613-3.1, Tractors and self-propelled machinery for agriculture — Air quality systems for cabs — Part 3: Filters for environmental cab HVAC systems, incudes modified acceptance levels and test conditions for the vapor test, as well as clarified wording.

ASABE recognizes that all standard are documents that must be revised to reflect changes in need or user feedback during application and use f the standard.

ASABE members with standards access and those with site-license privileges can access the full-text of the standard by electronic download in about two weeks. Location for the download is on the ASABE online Technical Library at: elibrary.asabe.org. Others can obtain a copy for a fee directly from the library or by contacting ASABE headquarters at OrderStandard@asabe.org.
